## ON CONOCEPHALUS PALLIDUS REDT.

## (Orthoptera: Tettigonidae) INJURING PADDY EARHEADR IN KERALA

Adult- and nymphs of Conorephalus palidus Redt., were observed to damage the unemerged paddy panicles by biting and feeding on them in the Agricultural College Farm, Vellayani, in February 1967. The grasshopper made elongated cuts on the sheath enveloping the tender panicle and drew out through them the rachii and florets outwards. (Fig. 1). They also fed on the tender sweet florets. The insert was found to be active in the early morning hours.

The adult (Fig. 2) is a long-horned grass-hopper about 55 mm long with green fore-wings and body. Other species of Conoce-pha us recorded as pests of rice include C. nitidulis Scop. noted as a foliage feeder in Africa (Morstatt 1913), C. saltator Sauss feeding on grains of hill rice in the Windward Island (Fennah 1948) and C.

fasciatus Deg. reported from Texas (Bowling 1962), This is the first time C. pallidus is observed as injuring rice.
