Project for Seed Production in Crops and Fisheries

A Project for Seed Production in agricultural crops and fisheries will be implemented in the Kerala Agricultural University (KAU) at an estimated cost of Rs.4.47 crores. The project is fully funded by ICAR and will be co-ordinated by the Directorate of Seed Research, Mau, UP. The project is implemented nationally in 85 ICAR institutes and Central-State Agricultural Universities at a cost of Rs.198.9 crores.

The project targets on the production of quality seed/ fish seed and planting materials and to enhance the spread of high yielding new varieties/hybrids. The project will focus on the production of breeder seed and to some extent of foundation seed and truthfully labelled seeds of field crops, horticultural crops and fisheries. In KAU the project is being implemented in the Regional Agricultural Research Stations at Ambalavayal, Pilicode, Pattambi and Kumarakom, Main Campus, Vellanikkara and College of Fisheries, Panangad.

Gramasree: Coloured Bird for Backyard Poultry



Gramasree, a poultry strain developed by the Centre for Advanced Studies in Poultry Science, College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Mannuthy is ideal for rural poultry. The birds are sturdy with medium body size and multicoloured plumage and patterns. The birds gain a body weight of 1.5 kg. at 20 weeks and lay first egg at 175 days. They lay attractive brown eggs. Average egg production is 180 and egg size 50g. Gramasree is suitable for foraging and scavenging. Smt. K. R. High over barriers



College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Mannuthy crosses 50 yrs.

The College was established in August, 1955 as the Government Veterinary College, Mannuthy, with a mandate to train veterinary professionals to meet the requirement of the State. Later, in 1961, the College also took up the responsibility of undertaking problem oriented research work, and got renamed as the Kerala Veterinary College and Research Institute. In 1972 it became a part of the Kerala Agricultural University and started to be known as the College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Mannuthy. Since then the college is involved in teaching, research and extension activities in the animal husbandry sector.

In the beginning, the college had only undergraduate programme of education and 10 departments. Now, there are 20 statutory departments, of which 18 offer Master's programme and 14 Doctoral research. The undergraduate programme, B.V.Sc & AH course is of five-year duration and regulated by the Veterinary Council of India Act. Apart from this, the institution is also engaged in training officers, military men, farmers, ladies and unemployed youth. The graduates of this institution extend their service not only to the animal husbandry sector of the state, but also to the army, civil service, banks, insurance and in various institutions abroad

The College has a library with more than 16,000 books, 6000 back volumes of Journals, and 650 research theses. Out side the curriculum the students are trained in NCC, NSS and Earn While You Learn activities. In the past years, the College has undertaken a number of research projects with the financial assistance of ICAR, DBT, NABARD, DST, CSIR etc. The findings on Ethmoid Carcinoma, Aflatoxicoses, Duck Plaque, Ranikhet Disease, Reproductive physio-pathology, Nutritional interventions, Unconventional feed ingredients and feeding practices etc. have brought national and international recognition. The contributions like, Athulya, Gramalakshmy and Gramasree strains of poultry, genetic conservation attempts like those on Vechur cows, native pigs, Kuttanad ducks, Kuttanad buffaloes, Malabari and Attappadi goats were also significant. The studies on Asian elephants attracted alobal attention.

The College has two referral hospitals, one of which has completed 100 years of exemplary service. The Centers of Excellence in Pathology and Meat Science, the Centers for Advanced Studies in Animal Breeding and Genetics and



Poultry Science are four leading projects for focused research. The Departments like Surgery, Medicine, Reproduction, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Parasitology and Nutrition are referral centers for the State. Animal farms maintaining cattle, buffaloes, goats, pigs, rabbits, small animals and poultry and duck are available in the campus.

Two major processing plants, one for milk and another for meat, are also working attached to the College. Two research stations, one at Thumboormuzhi of Thrissur district and another at Thiruvazhamkunnu of Palakkad district also add to the strength of the institution.

Security concerns drains national income

would have been able to alleviate poverty to a large extent if the Government could divert a portion of the amount it spends on maintaining security, said Shri, T.K.A. Nair, Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister. Shri.Nair was talking on the theme 'India-Today and Tomorrow' after inaugurating a lecture series and merit fete organized as a part of the golden jubilee celebration of the College of Veterinary & Animal Sciences. While advances were made in technology on one side, the security concerns raised by its misuse have made the security environment difficult, he observed. In a globalized scenario such unfavourable security concerns have a deleterious impact on development. In today's world, there is considerable scope to reduce security related concerns and channelise funds for the uplift of the marginalized section, the Principal Secretary said.

Govt.- Private tie up

Underscoring the importance of Govt- Private partnership, he stated that such tie up is vital for the healthy economy of the country. The Government has to play significant role in the globalized regime. Though it does have to play many of the traditional functions "the Government cannot just vanish. There can be changes in its roles from being an actual performer. It will have to work as a facilitator, umpire and regulator". In the context of globalization, the resource crunch will force the Government to withdraw many of its traditional functions "We can no more perceive the Government as sole agency to solve all our problems. On the other hand, the Government would have to take care to ensure that the available resources reached the lower strata in society. While globalization has brought in several positive developments in the society, there is increasing recognition that it has also marginalized large sections of society" Sri. Nair cautioned.

Gamma Chamber 5000

The Meat Technology Unit of the Department of Livestock Products Technology received an aid of Rs.39.5 lakhs from the Board of Research in Nuclear Science-Baba Atomic Research Centre for conducting meat irradiation studies at KAU. A Gamma Chamber 5000 was installed in the department and limited market trials were conducted utilizing meat and meat products irradiated at dose 2.0-2.5 kGy. It was found that beef irradiated at 2.5 kGv had an extended shelf life of 25-30 days in chiller storage against 3-5 days under conventional method. Similarly other meat and meat products like turkey, chicken, beef cutlet, minced beef and beef fry were also had extended shelf life under chiller storage.

It was also observed that irradiated product was organoleptically and physiochemically indistinguishable from that of non-irradiated samples.

Need for Strengthening Domestic Market for Fishery Products

Cri.G.Mohankumar, Chairman, MPEDA stressed the need for developing a strong domestic market for sea food products in order to meet the fluctuations in the international market. There are several hurdles for the exporters from developing countries for meeting quality stipulated for the international market. These hurdles include trade issues, environmental issues and quality problems. Sri.Mohankumar was delivering the Devidas Menon Endowment Lecture at the College of Fisheries, Panangad. He dealt with problems in the coming years for the developing countries in the international sea food trade. In 2020 sea food trade will be dominated by the developing countries. The share of aquaculture in seafood export trade will rise to 41%. However, at present the share of value added products in our export is mere 5%. Trade policies like anti dumping duty have affected India's export in this sector. There is need for greater transparency in quality requirements and safety management system

approach. There is a heavy cost for complying with the quality requirements of developed countries, which out seafood processing plants find difficult to shoulder. The US bio terrorism Act has also added to this, Dr.N.R.Menon, former Director, School of Marine Sciences distributed RKSDJ Trust Endowment and Fish Processing Best Student Awards to L. Manjusha, S. Prasanth and V.R.Devi. Dr. D.D. Nambudiri, Dean, College of Fisheries presided over the function. Sri.T.R.Menon offered felicitations. Dr.K.K.Varma proposed vote of thanks.

Best Paper Awards

The research paper entitled "Studies on production and storage potential of Synthetic Seeds in Cocoa (Theobroma Cacao L)" by K.Sudhakara, B.N.Nagarajon, A.V. Santhosh Kumar, K.K. Sunil Kumar and N.K. Vijayakumar, College of Forestry, published in the Seed Research Vol. 28 (2): 119-125, 2000 was adjudged as the best paper by the Indian Society of Seed Technology, New Delhi.
