## A NOTE ON THE EXISTANCE OF A NEW VARIETY OF PINEAPPLE

In India there are a number of pineapple varieties, the important ones being Kew, Queen and Mauritius. The variety Kew is also known as 'Giant Kew' and Cavenne'. The variety Oueen contains two more distinct types viz. Red Ripley Queen and Green Ripely Queen. The fruits of all the above mentioned varieties are oval or oval to cylindrical in shape with a well developed crown. An entirely different type of pineapple was observed in some hilly areas of Trivandrum District (Nedumangad Taluk). In this case the fruit is abnormally long and conical in shape and crown is reduced to small scaly leaves. be due to the transformation of the vegetative crown portion of the spikate inflorescence into floral parts. The scaly leaves towards the top of the crown are longer than those at the basal region. In this variety 'fruit-lets' are produced from the stalk at the base of the main fruit, instead of slips. The morphological characters of the plant and the fruit characters such as colour flavour are similar to those of Red Ripley Queen. The variety is locally known as 'Koompu puruthy'. It is known to exist in the above locality for the last forty years. This variety may have originated by mutation in Red Ripley Oueen. It is seen only in places where Red Ripley Queen is abundantly grown.

Owing to the fancy shape and colour of the fruit, this variety can very well find a place in ornamental gardens and also as a new type in the germplasm collection for future breeding works.

'റെഡ' റിപ്പിക്യൂൻ' എന്ന ഇനത്തോടു സാമ്യമുള്ള ഒരു പതിയ ഇനം കൈതച്ചക തിരുവനന്തപുരം ഡിസ്ട്രിക്ടിൽ നെടുമങ്ങാടു താലൂക്കിൽ കാണപ്പെട്ടു. ഇതു വളരെ നീള മുള്ളതും കോണിക്കൽ ആകൃതിയോടു കൂടിയതുമാണു്. ഈ ആകൃതി കാരണം ഒരു കൗതക സസ്യ മായി തോട്ടങ്ങളിൽ വെച്ച പിടിപ്പിക്കാനം, മററു നല്ല ഇനങ്ങരം ഉല്പാദിപ്പിക്കാൻ ജോപ്പാസ മായിട്ടം 'കമ്പ പുറത്തി' എന്ന നാടൻ പേരിൽ അറിയപ്പെടുന്ന ഈ ചെടി പററിയതാണു്
